

### Support for Daily Living

#### Q: What transportation services are available for seniors?

- MTS Access: MTS has a paratransit program for the disabled
- Reduced Fares: <u>MTS offers reduced fares for those over 65</u>
- <u>Call 211 or visit their website</u> for resources
- Many Medicare health insurance plans provide transportation for doctor appointments (consult with a <u>Medicare health insurance professional</u>)
- <u>Local Senior Centers</u> may offer assistance and referrals
- <u>Local transportation and in-home care companies</u> may offer senior-friendly transportation

# **Q**: What options are available for assistance with running errands, such as grocery shopping, and how can I access them?

- Local Senior Centers may offer assistance and referrals
- <u>Call 211 or visit their website</u>
- <u>Apply for CalFresh</u>
- Many local companies provide this service

# Q: Are there in-home caregiving services available for seniors or individuals with disabilities, such as companionship or respite care?

- Many <u>private in-home care agencies</u> offer hourly or live-in services, including personal care and companionship
- Call 211 or visit their website
- Apply for <u>IHSS</u> is through Medi-Cal (requires physician authorization).
- Many local companies advise on placement and respite care

### Meals & Food Assistance

#### Q: What meal delivery services are available for those in need?

- Some Medicare insurance plans offer post-hospitalization meal delivery (consult with a <u>Medicare health insurance professional</u>)
- Call 211 or visit their website
- Apply for CalFresh at <u>BenefitsCal.com</u>



### Meals & Food Assistance (continued)

- Apply for food assistance with 211
- Meal support through community and <u>nonprofit organizations</u>
- <u>Private in-home care companies</u> may offer meal preparation and grocery shopping

## **Q**: In the event of an evacuation warning, what assistance is available for disabled individuals?

- Disabled individuals can register with the <u>Access and Functional Needs (AFN)</u> <u>Registry</u> to ensure they receive evacuation support
- You can also <u>call 211</u> San Diego for coordination.
- Many private <u>in-home care agencies</u> can help prepare emergency plans and assist with evacuation logistics

# Q: Are there designated meet-up spots in Poway for emergency evacuations, such as those due to earthquakes, fires, or floods?

• Yes, the City of Poway activates evacuation centers in response to emergencies like wildfires or floods; monitor local alerts or visit <u>poway.org</u> for details and local emergency broadcasts with real-time instructions

# **Q**: What protocols are in place for responding to emergencies such as active shooters or power outages?

• Residents are encouraged to register at <u>AlertSanDiego.org</u> for real-time notifications and information, and to keep emergency supplies on hand

• Some <u>City of Poway programs</u> are resident-specific, but many regional services are open to all. Contact providers or <u>211 San Diego</u> for program eligibility.

#### **Q:** Are there cleaning services available for seniors?

• Many <u>local cleaning providers</u> offer services tailored to seniors, including housekeeping and deep cleaning; call providers directly to ask about senior discounts

### Medicare Insurance, Medi-Cal, and Medications

## **Q**: How can I reduce the cost of my prescriptions or find affordable medication options?

- Apply for Medi-Cal or for the federal Extra Help program
  - Apply at <u>BenefitsCal</u>
  - o <u>Medi-Cal Website</u>
  - o <u>Extra Help</u>
- Work with a <u>Medicare professional</u> to determine how to access pharmacies/plans that will best cover medications
  - o Local Insurance Resources
- Call or visit <u>local pharmacies</u> to inquire about discounts, prefilled medication boxes, delivery options, and specific medication counseling



### Medicare Insurance, Medi-Cal, and Medications (continued)

#### **Q: What will Medi-Cal pay for?**

- Medical visits and treatment
- Dental, Vision, behavioral health services
- In-home care (IHSS) and long-term care
- Monthly insurance premiums
- Additional assistance with medication cost and durable medical equipment
